Smokers' etiquette – separating fact from fiction


Even if you want to dispose of your cigarette responsibly, urban myths doing the rounds make it hard to know right from wrong. We separate fact from fiction.

They actually take up to 12 years to break down. That means if you drop a butt when you're 18, it could still be there when you're 30.




Claim 2:

Fact


